Dear Church Family,

The COVID-19 pandemic has presented us with an unprecedented challenge – that of being a church in “diaspora” – a community of faith that is scattered as we practice “social distancing” and “self-isolation”. We are, for the time being, a “virtual” church – worshipping, studying, and fellowshiping online and by phone. Although we’ve been temporarily forced out of the comfortable patterns we’re used to, by God’s grace we remain a strong, faithful, and caring church. Let me update what we’re doing to sustain our ministries in spite of the disruption:

Worship

- We are posting a worship video on our Facebook page each Sunday morning. The videos include our Music Director, Joey Mazzarella on keyboard with his wife Stephanie doing vocals, liturgists reading the day’s scripture, and Pastor Arlene preaching. You don’t need a Facebook account to view our page. Simply go to www.facebook.com and search for “Arnold Mills United Methodist Church”.
- Our “Virtual Coffee Hour” is Sunday mornings at 11:30 via Zoom. Grab your coffee and a snack and join us for fellowship. (Zoom is a video conferencing platform for your PC, tablet, or smartphone. Participants can see all the other participants ala “Hollywood Squares” or “The Brady Bunch”. If you don’t have an electronic device you can still participate via telephone. A 1-minute tutorial is available at bit.ly/2QOWN7L)
- In addition to Sunday worship, I’ve also been posting a brief video reflection each day on our Facebook page.

Communication

- Our office manager, George Jutras, is working primarily from home, but he checks the church voicemail frequently and will return your call as soon as possible. You can contact George at 401-333-5203 or office.amumc@gmail.com. I will also be working from home and can be reached at 401-335-5156 or pastor.amumc@gmail.com.
- We will be communicating mainly by email and Facebook. If you are not already receiving the weekly emails from the office, please contact George to have your address added to the mailing list. If you do not have internet access, please let George know and he will mail you any news or important announcements.

Pastoral Care

- I am making phone calls to several parishioners each day to check in. However, if you have a need or desire to talk, by all means call or email me rather than waiting for me to call you. I am happy to meet with you by phone, a private Zoom meeting, Skype, Facetime, etc.
- I will be on Zoom for virtual office hours on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 to noon. Feel free to drop in. (You can find all the links to recurring Zoom meetings below.)
- We have developed an online “Helping Hands” program, designed to match volunteers who are willing to lend a hand with people who are homebound or self-isolating. For example, a volunteer might pick up a grocery order or prescription. If you are interested in being a helper, or if you need help, please go to bit.ly/2Uoj8Lm. If you don’t have internet access, please call the office. If you are aware of someone who has a need, please be sure to let us know. If you need (or know someone else who needs) financial assistance, please contact me confidentially.

Pastoral Care (continued)

- I am hosting a prayer meeting on Zoom each Tuesday evening from 6:30 – 7:00. If you aren't able to attend, you can call or email me your prayer concern and I'll share it with the group. Please note that (unless you indicate otherwise) those prayer requests will not be included on the public prayer list that George sends out in an email each week.
- I will be on Zoom for "Kids' Time" on Sunday mornings from 10:00 – 10:30. This is an informal time for me to check in with the children, to let them see their Sunday School friends, and to have some fun (e.g., inviting the kids to share their favorite activity from the previous week).
- If your children would like to create cards, write notes, or draw something for our homebound members, please contact the office and George will send you their names and addresses.

Meetings and Studies

- All meetings, studies, etc., will take place on Zoom. Church committees will schedule Zoom meetings as needed.

We will decide when to resume normal operations in concert with the Bishop, District Superintendent, the RI Department of Health, and the Federal CDC. While it's impossible to know with any certainty at this point in time, it seems unlikely that the coronavirus crisis will be over in time for Holy Week and Easter services. We are currently planning online worship in the event that we are unable to gather in person.

Finally, please remember that the church continues to need your financial support. We understand that some of you may be out of work and are unable to sustain the same level of giving. However, if your income has not been affected, kindly remember that our mission and ministry go on and the church continues to have expenses even while we are not gathering for worship. Know that I am praying for each one of you and for our church. I trust that we are strong enough to weather this storm, because I trust in the One upon whose faithfulness this community is built. Let us continue to be intentional about caring for one another and for our neighbors, even if from a distance. And when we do finally gather again to worship together in the sanctuary, what a day of praise and celebration that will be! In the meantime, "May the Lord watch between me and thee, when we are absent one from another" (Genesis 31:49).

March Trustees Report

The trustees of AMUMC met on March 11, 2020. As you read the following notes, please keep in mind that the scheduled events have since been postponed due to the corona virus outbreak.

- Tom Cabana, our treasurer reported that our portfolio as of 02/29/20 was down \$70,850.
 - Fran Carr reported that heating issues this winter have persisted and the cost of repairs is now close to \$4000. Fran also reported that Bill Gardener will be edging and mulching the Cargill Hall area.
 - Scott Murphy reported that the emergency lights in the back basement need new batteries. Eastland Electric will be contacted.
 - Dave Larson obtained a second estimate for power washing, repairing and painting parts of the church and the entire parsonage. The trustees would like to go with the first estimate we had received in the fall and voted to send them both on to the Council for discussion. (As a footnote, months ago the trustees had \$30,000 for the painting project set aside in a money market fund.)
 - The committee voted to delay the parking lot and driveway repairs except possibly the driveway at the parsonage.
 - The television in the sanctuary will eventually be mounted on the wall where the hymn board hangs now. Paul Roeber also presented his study on technology use in three other New England churches. Our estimated costs to upgrade were discussed.
 - Building Usage events presented by Lindsay Gettinger include:
 - 4/4/20 Annual Scout Grounds Spring Clean Up (rain date 4/11/20)
 - 3/27/20 memorial service for Carolyn Miller Sullivan (daughter of a former pastor Reverend Edmund Miller)
 - 4/4/20 Space2Thrive Easter Party
 - 4/5/20 Ethan McLaren, Eagle Scout bake sale
 - 5/2/20 the Scouts requested use of the hall and kitchen for a Pancake Breakfast.
This was denied due to a previously scheduled event.
 - Phil Lord, our custodian has been contacted about additional cleaning needs due to the virus.
 - Pastor Arlene has notified us of a few minor repairs needed at the parsonage. We are working on them! Until we meet again, stay healthy. It will be one joyful Sunday when we do open up AMUMC!

NEW DISTRICT STRUCTURE

As of July 1, 2020, the New England Conference will have seven districts rather than the current nine. The move to fewer districts is a matter of rightsizing them for the number of members and churches in New England. This puts our districts in line with those of the other conferences in the Northeastern Jurisdiction.



In deciding the new district boundaries decided attention was given to the historical and cultural differences in each area, and every attempt was made to balance the workload among the superintendents with consideration given to culture, history, church size, distances and traffic patterns. Under this new structure, each district has grown by approximately 20 churches except for the Green Mountain District, which retains its former boundaries.

The new districts are:

Katahdin District – Maine is divided into two districts; these are the churches in the Northern/Downeast half. Rev. Dr. Jacquelyn Brannen is the DS.

Many Waters District – Maine is divided into two districts; these are the churches in the southern/western half. Rev. Dr. Karen Munson is the DS.

Green Mountain District – The churches in Vermont. Rev. Jill Colley Robinson is the DS.

Granite District – The churches in New Hampshire. Rev. Taesung Kang is the DS.

Commonwealth District – The churches in Massachusetts west of Interstate 495. Rev. Megan Stowe is the DS.

Freedom Trail District — The churches in Massachusetts east of Interstate 495. Rev. We Hyun Chang is the DS

Seacoast District – Churches in Connecticut, Rhode Island, and Southeastern Massachusetts, including Cape Cod and Islands. Rev. Dr. David Calhoun is the DS.

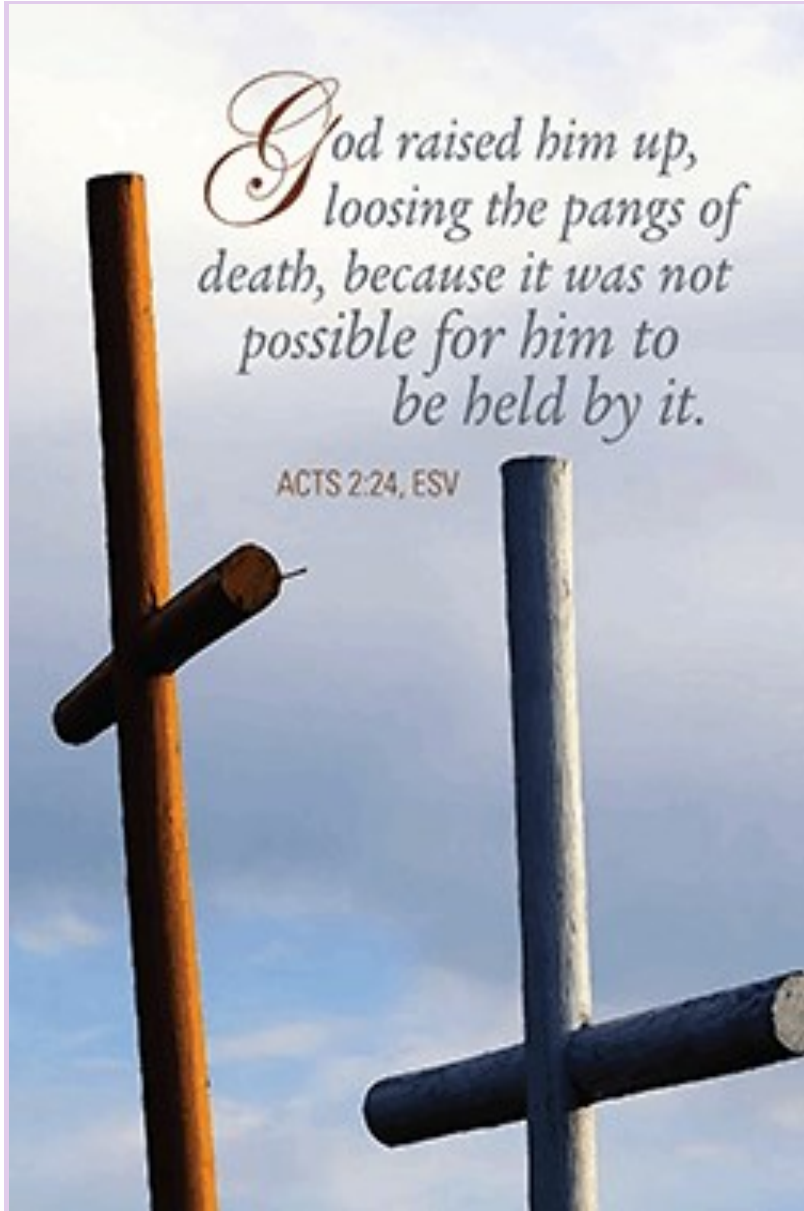
Clothing and Boxed and Canned Goods Donations
